The Inuulitsivik Health Centre (CSI), with more than 900 employees, is part of the health and social services network of Quebec, Nunavik region. It provides the population of the Hudson Bay Territory of approximately 7,000 people with front-line health and social services including prevention, assessment, diagnosis and treatment, rehabilitation and support. In addition, it provides youth protection services and management for the Nunavik region of Ullivik in Montreal. Its mission is to welcome Inuit people who need to receive health services in participating Montreal hospitals. The Inuit population is distributed in seven communities on the Hudson Bay coast from Kuujuaaraapik to Salluit.

REQUIREMENT :

An undergraduate university education. Exceptional work experience may be considered;

A knowledge of the reality and values of the people of the territory;

Speaking and writing fluent English and Inuktitut

Having a good knowledge of French is an important asset;

A good knowledge of the organization and operation of a health facility and social services.
