

The Honourable Joe Savikataaq, Minister responsible for the Utility Rates Review Council (URRC), is seeking candidates for available positions on the Review Council. Beneficiaries of the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement are encouraged to apply.

The URRC is an arms-length advisory council that assesses rate, policy development, and major project applications submitted by the Qulliq Energy Corporation (QEC). The Council provides professional application analysis and recommendations to the Minister responsible for QEC. Within the last three years the Council has examined applications related to Nunavut-wide electrical rates, street lighting, construction of new power plants and the introduction of renewables into Nunavut's energy mix.

The Council seeks engaged professionals with an interest in contributing to the ongoing development of Nunavut's electrical systems and policies. Council members are encouraged to directly engage in application assessment and reporting processes through the development of questions related to the applications presented to the council and by taking part in report drafting and editing.

Council members are chosen for their knowledge, skills, and experience. The Council provides opportunities for regulatory training and is supported by a team of professional regulators as well as a national association of regulators.

The URRC expects that prospective new Council members should:

- Have a sound business and regulatory understanding or other relevant experience that would prove to be an asset to the Council's operations.
- Be able to commit the time and effort to study and evaluate the matters brought before the Council and engage in periodic travel for public meetings and educational opportunities.
- Adhere to Nunavut's conflict of interest guidelines.

Membership is for a three-year term. Per section 3 (4) of the *Utilities Rate Review Council Act*, no person employed in the public service may be appointed to, or serve as a member or temporary member of, the Review Council. This includes all employees of Federal, Territorial, Provincial and Municipal governments.

Council members sit on an as and when required basis. This is not part or full-time employment. Members need to be able to maintain a schedule that permits for occasional periods of travel for up to one week. Honoraria and per diems (when travelling for the business of the council) are provided per the Nunavut Financial Administration Manual. Access to email for correspondences and a telephone for teleconferences is required.
