Call for Members at Large Legal Services Board of Nunavut

This is an opportunity for members-at-large to serve on the Legal Services Board of Nunavut (LSB) of Directors.

The candidate should be an individual who is a respected member of their community who has experience in dealing with social justice issues. LSB members are required to attend a minimum of three (3) in-person Board meetings annually, and attendance at up to two (2) additional tele- or video-conference Board meetings may be required. Board members may be selected to serve on the Executive or other Committees of the Board. Executive members can expect to attend an additional six (6) meetings a year. Board Members are eligible for Honoraria as per Government of Nunavut Directive for Public Agencies.

The LSB is mandated to ensure the provision of legal aid services to all eligible Nunavummiut. The Board administers the *Legal Services Act* and regulations and reviews legal services provided in the territory. Members can expect to work collaboratively with a team of legal professionals on the provision of legal services to Nunavummiut.
